#### Popometer

When you're shopping for a new car, what do you rely on most as your deciding factor? Some people may rely on ratings, reviews or research, but most of us make the decision based on how the car feels when we test-drive it.

The German word Popometer comes from Popo (a colloquial word for your buttocks) and Meter (a measuring stick). A Popometer is a word that describes someone's rear end as a measuring device. When someone sit down in a new car, motorcycle or even on a bobsled or a bicycle, they get a feel for the vehicle - a measurement of comfort taken by their buttocks. When a professional reviewer or race car driver tests a vehicle, the results of his or her Popometer are very important, since it measures the level of comfort someone may experience in that vehicle for years to come.

Although the term is often used in automobile magazines or by people who review vehicles, it is perhaps most commonly used by race car drivers in Germany. The closest English translation is "seat-of-the-pants feel".

Even if a car has high ratings and good reviews, you will probably not want to buy it if a reviewer's Popometer gives it a low score. So make sure to find out what the Popometer says about it, since those results are ultimately the most important!

### Germany Named 2017's "Country of the Year" For BioFach Fair in Nuremberg

Germany has been named 2017's "Country of the Year" for the BioFach Fair in Nuremberg. BioFach is the world's leading trade fair for organic food and now in its 25th year of hosting at the Exhibition Fair Nuremberg. The fair will welcome upwards of 50,000 trade visitors from 130 countries from February 15 to 18.

Germany's presentation in February as "Country of the Year" will be under the motto "Building an Organic Future." Organic food production accounts for roughly four percent of the German food market. In 2013, there were around 23,300 farms which worked according to the organic farming regulations. Together, they farm six percent of the agriculturally-used land – over a million hectares.

In addition to the relatively large cultivation of organic farms, Germany was selected due to its innovation and generosity supporting organic farming beyond its country's border. During the fair, experts will highlight Germany's use of sustainable cultivation methods, their focus on regional solutions, and on the prioritization of biodiversity and animal rights. There will also be information provided on German businesses which have long been engaged overseas in supporting the efforts of developing countries to start or improve the production of organic goods.

With the appearance of Germany as "Country of the Year", the German organic trade sector can present its entrepreneurial spirit, its innovative capacity, and its sense of responsibility, for the world to take note of.
